The only difference, besides the additional storage space, is the protective wood top, which turns the tool cabinet into a friendly little workstation. Ranger has also equipped their complete line of tool cabinets with a tamperproof, tumbler key lock to secure all of your valuable tools safe and sound when you aren't around. Bolt cutters or a hacksaw won't be able to penetrate the locking system, so the last thing you'll have to worry about is your sticky-fingered friends "borrowing" your stuff.

Our garage is filled with project bikes—some are personal projects and others, like the Lonely King, are experiencing major reconstructive surgery for the benefit of our readers. To help us along with our many editorial endeavors, Pitbull Motorcycle Lifts graced our humble garage with one of their foot-pump manual lift numbers.

In no time, we were dancing a one-step while our two-wheeled partner was raised to eye level.

The manual Pitbull lift is quite an impressive addition to any garage, as it uses a 6-ton hydraulic jack, elevates to a full 25 inches and maxes out at 1,450-pound loads. The 6-ton hydraulic system is used for added strength and durability, as it will only be lifting a fraction of its capacity, which lessens the amount of mechanical maintenance. The precision 4-inch casters make for easy repositioning and moving, even while the lift is bench-pressing a bike.

Pitbull features a 100 percent MIG-welded, eight-piece lift frame, which provides excellent strength



and stability that eliminates the need to tie down most motorcycles. Four swivel "D" rings, one in each corner, are welded into the jack for additional security.

We would be lost without the Pitbull lift in our garage, not to mention bored. The jack has enabled us to get more bikes off the ground and back down again with ease and a warm feeling in our guts. If you are seriously contemplating purchasing a lift for your garage, spend a few more bucks and buy a Pitbull. The manual lift is on sale now for \$419—a steal if you ask us.
